2021 Moon of the Month

Anishinaabe: Bear Moon (Mkwa Giizis)- When we honour the vision quest that began in the fall. During this time, we discover how to see beyond reality and to communicate through energy rather than sound. This moon also gives us a special teaching about the birth of bear cubs. In February, there is one morning when there is a heavy fog in the air and the traditional person knows that this is happening.

Cree: The Great Moon (Kisipisim)- Animals do not move around much and trappers have little chance of catching them.

Inuit: Miscarriage Moon (Avunnivik)- At a time when Inuit men spent most of their time outdoors to hunt, they observed Caribou having abortions because of severe cold weather. The embryo would start to develop naturally but then the growth aborted until there was nothing left. Avuniq means an embryo's growth has stopped and miscarriage taking place.

Haudenosaunee: Feast for the Dead (Ohkhi:we).

Algonquin: (Apicuummilcum)- Ice river is gone.
