

Welcome to Kindergarten Local Supports and Resources

Early Identification

- <u>Front Door</u> provides support in accessing mental health services and supports in Waterloo Region for children and youth.
- <u>KidsAbility</u> provides programs and services for children and youth. Programs and services include: occupational therapy, speech and language, autism services, behaviour support services and more.
- <u>Zero2Six</u> is a program geared to families with children birth to six years of age to support areas such as positive parenting strategies, social and emotional development, behavioural challenges and others. This program offers one-time individual consultations and/or ongoing home-based support.
- <u>KW Habilitation</u> provides a wide range of individualized services and supports to children with any special need of topics including: children with special needs, dental health, child safety, parenting support, positive parenting, and more.

Multicultural Resources

- <u>Kitchener-Waterloo Multicultural Centre</u> provides support and assistance to newcomers to our community and then later to provide interpretation and translation services.
- <u>YMCA of Three Rivers Immigrant Services</u> provides support, programs, services and workshops for families and individuals who are newcomers to Waterloo Region.
- Anishnabeg Outreach Provides indigenous people with access to culturally appropriate services and supports.

Recreation and Child Care Support

- <u>Fee Assist</u> provides opportunities for families to access fee assistance for activities and programs offered by the YMCA of Three Rivers including recreation programs, camping and more!
- <u>OneList Waterloo Region</u> provides opportunity for families to register for licensed child care as well as some before-and-after school programs in Waterloo Region.
- <u>The Region of Waterloo's Child Care Subsidy Program</u> provides financial assistance for qualifying families to support access to high-quality Child Care programs within Waterloo Region.
- <u>Early Learning and Child Care Navigators</u> are funded by the Region of Waterloo Community Services. These positions have been developed in response to our greater community's need to improve equitable access within Early Learning and Child Care services for equity-seeking populations.
